



BEAUJOLAIS-VILLAGES

Les Collines de Quincé

The Terroir

The Beaujolais Villages area is located in the most southern district of Burgundy. The soil is composed mainly of ancient rock formations from the decomposed volcanic plateaus formed many, many years ago. The vineyards have mostly a south - southeast exposure at approximately 350m (1,200 feet) above sea level with a moderate output of 50 hectolitres per hectare.

Varietal / Cepage

Gamay, red grape with white juice

Vinification

The grapes are hand harvested in whole bunches or clusters at the optimum time of maturity, and then carefully sorted and selected with the supervision of wine cellar manager Jean-Luc Chagny. During the 10 day fermentation period traditional Beaujolais methods are utilized including carbonic semi maceration under strict temperature controls.

Description

This wonderful Beaujolais-Villages is deep ruby red in color with aroma's of red fruits and subtle spicy notes. The mouth is sharp and filled with just the right amount of fruity roundness and well balanced tannins.

Food Pairing

Goes well with red meats in sauces, grilled pork and fresh strawberries and pastries.

Suggested Serving Temperature

Serve slightly chilled around 15° to 18° C (60° to 65° F)
Best consumed 1 to 4 years after bottling.
